


ANNUAL REPORT 2016-17

The contribution of CIIT in research is evident from the fact that it was ranked second in research productivity among all universities of Pakistan in 2015 and can proudly state that CIIT crossed milestone of 1,000 impact factor publications in a calendar year. Moreover, it attained No. 01 position in Pakistan in TIMES Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings (WUR) 2016-17 and was among 601-800 in the

world. Furthermore, CIIT was also ranked among 151-200 best young universities of the world and among top 150 universities in Asia by THE Ranking of 2017. It was also ranked 137 in THE BRICS and Emerging Economies Rankings of 2017. Besides these, CIIT is ranked among top 250 Asian Universities as per QS University Rankings of 2016.

The Institute also carried out various public welfare activities during the year, considering it its responsibility to give back to the society. On the whole, this year has observed growth and achievement in various areas such as programs being offered, student enrollment, infrastructure, ranking, etc. Moving forward, CIIT will continue its efforts in providing quality education and services.

Executive Summary

CIIT was established in 1998 as a Center of Excellence of Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS) with a vision to revolutionize the higher education paradigm. The CIIT has completed its 17 years and it is delightful to share that the Institute has been continuously improving, and the year 2016-17 is no exception.

This Annual report starts with an overview of the Institute, highlighting some important facts like mission, vision, and structure of Institute. The first chapter befittingly covers the academic activities describing the variety of programs being offered at CIIT. CIIT is proud to have 3-star rating by the QS for its quality education and services. This chapter highlights the foreign academic and institutional linkages with 07 MoUs signed during the reporting period.

The chapter two elaborates the Research and Development activities, be it in terms of projects, publications, conferences, seminars, and workshops. The detail of those held during the reporting period is incorporated in this chapter. Few of the major workshops/seminars/ symposia include Technomoot, Frontiers of Information Technology (FIT), SAICON, Global Forum on Islamic Finance, etc. The chapter also provides information about the research collaborations and activities, significantly, the research publications during 2016 reached to a figure of 1,500 making a total of 7,132. The Institute has also filed 16 patents for registration during the reporting period. CIIT also has the honor of being ISO 9000:2008 certified, which is the most popular standard of Quality

Management System internationally. The third chapter is about Quality Assurance and significant steps taken in ensuring quality of teaching and research in the Institute.

CIIT understands the importance of competent faculty and to provide them with opportunities for growth and development. Chapter four describes the faculty development at CIIT which is the largest faculty development program among the universities/institutions of higher education in the country. The faculty members stand at a figure of 3,193 during the reporting period including 1,086 PhDs. Until June 30, 2017, 548 scholars have returned and rejoined CIIT after completing their higher studies abroad. Faculty Development Academy (FDA) of the Institute has continued to provide preservice and in-service trainings to cater the training needs of the faculty. International faculty is also engaged in order to provide diversity among the faculty.

Chapter five enlists the basic facts about the students like enrollment, equity, and faculty-student ratio, etc. The student enrollment as of June 30, 2017 is 34,485. The highest enrollment was observed in Faculty of Information Sciences and Technology with 13,349 students.

The next chapter, Universities Building Economies, contains the information on linkages established with the industry and the activities of Business Incubation Center (BIC) in promoting entrepreneurship. The Institute understands and realizes its duty of providing students with as all possible help and guidance during their stay at CIIT. In order to help them in their

career development, CIIT has established internship and placement offices at its campuses which are also responsible for career counseling of the students. Different workshops/seminars are organized by these offices to make students aware of the challenges they may face in their careers.

Chapter seven and eight highlight the strengthening of physical and technological infrastructure including details of development and construction projects, research equipment, digital library, PERN, video conferencing, etc. Until the end of FY 2016-17, CIIT has completed 48 development projects, while 04 projects are on-going. New research equipment was purchased during the reporting period at campuses. The library at CIIT provides access to more than 33,000 high quality journals/articles/databases through HEC's Digital Library provision. Chapter nine provides information about the public service activities, which CIIT feels its obligations.

Besides teaching and learning, sports and co-curricular activities are very helpful in developing strong personalities and instilling various traits. The events held/participated in this regard during the reporting period are elaborated in chapter ten and eleven. The next chapter provides financial information while chapter thirteen covers the paradigm of University Governance. Chapter fourteen highlights Office of Development, its initiatives and future plans. The report in hand ends with chapter fifteen, which provides generic details about medical/health facilities available at campuses of CIIT, and counseling service being provided for stress reduction. The report concludes with relevant annexure supplementing the information contained in the report.

Since then, CIIT has become one of the major leading higher education institutes. Its futurist leadership, relentless positive energy, and fervent human resource earned CIIT a Degree Awarding Charter from the Government of Pakistan in 2000.

CIIT is a multi-campus Institute offering assorted degree programs in the fields of Science, Engineering, Technology, Architecture, Design, Business, etc. Currently, there are seven functional campuses of CIIT at Islamabad, Abbottabad, Wah, Lahore, Attock, Sahiwal, and Vehari along with a Virtual Campus and a few more are in the pipeline.






Convocations

Till June 30, 2017, CIIT has produced 44,371 graduates out of which 183 are PhDs. During the reporting period, 7,250 graduates were produced including 32 PhDs.



Foreign Academic Linkages

Establishing foreign academic linkages has gained paramount significance over the years. Identifying and exploring the various areas of collaboration such as joint research, student and faculty exchange, joint conferences, and other academic activities, has become one of the key areas for educational institutions.

During the reporting period, 07 international MoUs were signed with the reputed institutions and organizations from China, Morocco, Turkey, USA, and UK. 235 international MoUs have been signed so far.

Also in order to benefit from a mutuality of purpose, 06 national MoUs with prestigious higher education institutions and R&D organizations representing various provinces of Pakistan were conceived and signed. 87 national MoUs have been signed so far. The list of MoUs is provided at Annexure (A).

The detail of few of these linkages is as follows:

Kumamoto University, Japan

Japan Science and Technology Agency annually offers "Japan-Asia Youth Exchange Program in Science". A team of 10 members from CIIT Wah went to Kumamoto University Japan using the platform of UNESCO Water Chair for capacity building in Hydro-informatics from January 16-25, 2017.

Chongqing University of Science and Technology, China

A MoU was signed on April 17, 2017 to promote exchange of teacher and students, exchange of academic materials and information, participate in conferences and academic meetings.



The China University of Petroleum, Beijing, China

A MoU was signed on April 20, 2017 to promote exchange of teacher and students, exchange of academic materials and information, conduct joint research projects and training programs.

Southern China Technology University (SCUT) Guangzhou (School of Electrical Power and Systems)

CIIT Lahore signed an agreement with the University in 2017.

CIIT Lahore signed an agreement with the University in 2017. The purpose of this agreement is joint working on R&D projects and sharing knowledge, dissemination of technologies/products/processes, training of manpower in renewable energy technologies in SCUT China.

CIIT Lahore signed an agreement with the University in 2017. The purpose of this agreement is joint working on R&D projects, sharing knowledge renewable/solar & biomass dissemination of technologies/products /processes, training of manpower in renewable energy.

Yasar University, Turkey

According to the MOU, the main areas of cooperation will be exchange of scholars and staff, graduate and undergraduate students, exchange of academic information and materials, joint research activities and publications, participation in conferences and academic meetings, and other academic exchanges that both universities agree to.

In celebration of 71 years of United Nations'(UN), CIIT in collaboration with the UN Information Centre (UNIC) organized the launch of the first UN Corner in Pakistan at Junaid Zaidi Library on October 19, 2016. Mr. Asim Iftikhar, Director General (UN), Ministry of Foreign Affairs, inaugurated the corner which will serve as repository of newsletters, journals, reports, magazines and books published by UN systems and its

partners on national, regional and global issues. The model of the corner was originally designed by students of CIIT Architecture & Design department and soon identical corners will be set up in universities and UN Offices across Pakistan with sponsorship from the Swiss Agency for Development & Cooperation (SDC). CHAPTER 02

Research & Development



An Overview

The mission of CIIT's meshes very well with its strategic aim for developing a knowledge economy benefitting socio-economic environment in the country. To fulfill its ideas, the Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) was established in 2011 with the aim of linking university research directly with educational, social and economic priorities of CIIT and its broader communities. The ORIC slogan is "Creating endless opportunities by transforming research into prosperity."

The ORIC at CIIT operates with the following Terms of Reference:

- Enhancing research culture
- Promoting inter/cross disciplinary research
- Building university industry linkages
- Inculcating entrepreneurship among researchers
- Generating intellectual property through research, innovation, and commercialization
- Establishing technology/innovation/business parks
- Catalyzing technology transfer through spin off companies and licensing
- Augmenting capacity building of research/corporate community

In this context it will not be out of place to mention here that from the last few years the progress of ORIC is rapidly improving. Especially in term of Research Projects, Travel Grants to faculty members, patents, holding of International Conferences and publication of research papers in national and international Journals by the faculty of CIIT. During 2016-17, 270 research projects and 121 travel grant applications were submitted by CIIT to different funding agencies out of which 148 projects and 85 travel grant applications were approved. During the same year, 1500 publications have been recorded.

Operations of ORIC

During the reporting period, following activities were carried out through ORIC:

CIIT Research Grant Program (CRGP)

ORIC undertook diversification of CIIT's research portfolio by identifying and submitting research proposals to multifaceted national and international funding agencies. To improve the above targets more, ORIC developed a booklet "Research Grant Programs of National and International Funding Agencies" for the convenience of CIIT faculty and researchers. In addition to above, a program namely CIIT Research Grant Program (CRGP) was introduced in 2005 to award research grants to young faculty members up to Rs 200,000/- for a duration of two years. During the year 2016-17, under the said program, 37 research proposals were approved and funds released to the awardees.

Research Productivity Awards

CIIT also encourages its faculty to enhance quality research. CIIT-Research Productivity Awards is the annual activity. A



The approved PhD Supervisors are the backbone for a university. In this regard, 487 CIIT faculty members have been approved as PhD Supervisors by HEC up to fiscal year 2016-17.

Intellectual Property Rights

Intellectual Property (IP) Rights is of paramount importance in order to protect inventor's rights and produce research that will provide full innovation and commercialization. CIIT has developed in-house capacity to provide IP support to its researchers and file patent applications locally and internationally. During 2016-17, CIIT filed 10 US patents, 01 UK patent and 05 Pakistani patents based on applied research of its faculty while 5 patents (US 4+Pak 1) were accepted. CIIT also provided trainings on understanding IP Rights and Patenting to researchers from many universities.



ORIC- Professional Development (ORIC-PD)

ORIC-PD is a flagship program of the ORIC at CIIT whose goal is equipping professionals with modern knowledge and skills

which are favored by leaders of different professions and exposing the faculty to industry needs in training and development. Our seminars contain an excellent combination of lectures, discussion, and hands-on workshops to ensure learning is maximized. The over-arching objective of the program is to expose CIIT faculty to practical application of knowledge through direct interaction with practitioners.

A number of training activities for university researchers in broader areas ranging from scientific manuscript and research proposal writing, to drafting patents, as well as using SPSS, AMOS for social sciences

and health research were organized. Similarly, in order to cater to the needs of the industry, areas like ISO 17025 accreditation, drug discovery and development, strategic foresight, food safety and improving drug delivery standard at community pharmacy were touched. Engagement with the Pharmaceutical Industry was the highlight of the year, with participation from Cirin Pharma, Don Valley Pharmaceuticals, Shaigan Pharma, Nabi Qasim Pharmaceuticals, D. Watsons Chemists, Nelson Group of Pharmacies and Warafana Pharmaceuticals in our programs. Furthermore, workshops and awareness activities underscoring teaching and research skills in line with the mandate of ORIC were also conducted. It is worthwhile mentioning that over 800 industry professionals, researchers, faculty members and experts have benefitted from ORIC-PD training workshops and activities.

Seminar on Science Centers and Science Museums, November 17, 2016

As part of efforts to promote scientific thought and learning, ORIC-PD partnered with COMSATS Secretariat to organize this seminar, commemorating the World Science Day for Peace and Development. The seminar was chaired by honorable Dr. Ishtar Ahmad, N.I.,H.I.,S.I.veteran Pakistani nuclear physicist, emeritus professor of high-energy physics at the National Center for Physics, and

former science advisor to the Government of Pakistan.

ORIC-PD partnered with the Islamabad City Traffic Police to organize a three day awareness session on defensive driving for the benefits of its staff drivers as well as students and faculty.



Research Publications

Products Developed by Center for Advanced Studies in Telecommunication (CAST)

CIIT Faculty Café Menu

This application was launched by CAST in May 2017 to facilitate the fellow faculty members by updating them with the faculty café menu on daily basis. The sever end of application is deployed at faculty café and the menu is updated on daily basis.

Scan and Save Business Card

Important business cards are often lost and it is hard to save information from all cards manually. Therefore to address this

problem an intelligent application based on optical character recognition was developed in June 2017 which automatically scans and saves all information available on a business card in the phone contact.

CIIT is committed to serve the nation with the aim of satisfaction and maintaining high international standardized higher educational academic and research pursuits in the CIIT system. CIIT's leadership has very keenly commitment for enhancement of quality standardization and assigned top priority for making CIIT as shining star in world's horizon. For achieving this task all stakeholders contributed with academic and research excellence for meeting the national and international educational standardization and Quality Assurance in all programs as per Higher Education Commission (HEC) guidelines. The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) has played a pivotal role to pursue for achieving the high standards and Quality Assurance with ISO Quality Management System (QMS) pre-requisites.

By realizing the fact that quality is an integral component in higher education and research as a strategic imperative, CIIT manifested its progressive mission continuously by establishing the QEC in the year 2006, and since then, has taken bold initiatives to attain, manage and enhance quality at the institutional level in all cadres of the Institute's management, academic and administration. For making CIIT a quality-centric institution, the QEC has undertaken various quality assurances based assignments and achieved highest "W" category at national level from HEC in Yearly Progress Report (YPR) continuously from the last 04 years (2012 to 2016) and amicably cultivated the quality culture at all levels in CIIT system.

Impact of Quality Assurance in the University

Quality Assurance and Assessment Process (QAAP) of CIIT Academic Programs

The Quality Assurance and Assessment Process (QAAP) of all Academic Programs (being a continuous process across CIIT) were undertaken. The QEC has coordinated for the implementation and also monitored the QAAP across CIIT. QEC managed awareness/training sessions, workshops and also conducted the systematic process of gathering, reviewing and using important quantitative and qualitative data and information from multiple and diverse sources about educational programs.

QEC completed Self-Assessment process of 56 programs: 04 programs till 2008; 29 programs till 2011; 18 programs till 2013; 05 programs till 2014, during 2015 SARs of 54 more programs were submitted to HEC. During 2016, the Self-Assessment Process was initiated for 116 programs at 8 campuses of CIIT. So far, 98 SARs of 8 campuses are prepared and are ready for the next stage of Assessment Process which is likely to be completed by the end of Spring 2018.

QEC also developed a Uniform Assessment Survey (UAS) Policy for implementation across CIIT system for course evaluation by the teachers/faculty and incorporated its results in SARs.



International Ranking of CIIT Pakistan

CIIT maintained its position in 231-240 range of top Asian Universities announced by QS Asian University Rankings in 2016. According to subject wise, CIIT was ranked in 401-500 in Computer Science and Information Systems in the year 2016. CIIT also achieved a position in top 601-800 international world universities as per Times Higher Education (THE) International world ranking.

HEC National Rankings of CIIT Pakistan

CIIT oriented itself to the improvement and implementation of quality and in this endeavor, successfully helped in making QA procedures and practices a part of the university quality management system. To this effect, it performed the major task of completing/filling up of the HEC Ranking Proforma along with evidences and provided to Quality Assurance

statutory and non-statutory bodies and forums and provided significant input on the quality of academic programs, courses and scheme of studies, and contributed in preparation of new academic programs and overall processes and practices of quality assurance in CIIT system.

ISO 9001-2008 QMS Certification

CIIT ensured strict adherence with the ISO 9001:2008 QMS standards till mid of the year 2017 at all CIIT campuses. The QEC amicably monitored and facilitated 2nd External Annual Surveillance ISO Audit in December 2016 for continuation of ISO certification of all campuses which was successfully completed and certification was awarded by NQA-UKAS United Kingdom for the year 2017.

Revised ISO 9001-2015 QMS Certification

The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) revised the ISO 9001:2008 Standard and introduced the new/revised version of ISO 9001:2015 which will be implemented after the External Audit of CIIT QMS expected to be held in December 2017 for the new three years tenure from 2018-2021. The QEC in July-September 2016 arranged two days training for Head of Departments (HoDs), Management

Representatives, Departmental ISO Coordinators/Implementers and ISO Internal Auditors at all six campuses wherein they were apprised about the differences between the old and new versions of standard as well as the methodology of addressing the clauses of the revised version for successful implementation of the revised version. QEC also arranged an exclusive session for the HoDs of CIIT Lahore in November-December 2016.

Participation in International Events

QEC represented CIIT at international forums by participating in the following events:

- Mr. Shahid Iqbal, Additional Registrar, QEC, represented in the 12th QS-Apple Conference on "New Directions in Asia-Pacific Higher Education Challenges and Opportunities" held from November 22-24, 2016 in Malaysia. It was jointly organized by the QS Asia Quacquarelli Symonds and University of Malaysia Perlis. The conference was useful for professionals of higher education involved in international networking, innovation in higher education etc. The summit was also helpful in obtaining the knowledge about higher education business models, the latest trends and market intelligence.
- Prof. Dr. Izhar Hussain, Registrar CIIT and Mr. Shahid Iqbal, Additional Registrar, QEC represented CIIT in the INQAAHE Biennial Conference 2017, "Quality Assurance in HE Between Collaboration & Competition: Promises and Challenges" held from February 27 to March 02, 2017 in Bahrain jointly organized by the International Network for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (INQAHHE) and National Authority for Qualifications & Quality Assurance of Education and Training, Kingdom of Bahrain. Topics and themes of the presentations and posters on different aspects of Quality Assurance in Higher Education were very useful and knowledgeable.
- Mr. Shahid Iqbal, Additional Registrar, QEC, represented CIIT in the UNESCO Regional Conference "Assurance in Higher Education" held from June 15-16, 2017 at Shenzhen, China. The conference was jointly organized for the APQN members by the UNESCO Asia-Pacific Regional Bureau for Education in Bangkok, Thailand and the Section of Higher Education, UNESCO in Paris, in collaboration with the Chinese National Commission for UNESCO and the UNESCO International Centre for Higher Education Innovation (UNESCO-ICHEI). The conference was useful for professionals of higher education involved in innovative policies and practices at system, institution, subject and program levels in Asia-Pacific, with an aim to produce a consolidated regional report on quality assurance in higher education.

Membership of International Associations


QEC maintains CIIT's membership of international Associations/Networks dealing with the quality of education, such as Association of Quality Assurance Agencies of the Islamic World (AQAAIW), International Network for Quality Assurance Agency in Higher Education INQAAHE), Asia-Pacific Quality Network (APQN), CHEA International Quality Group(CIQG) and International Association of Universities (IAU) for promoting the quality culture and research that is at par with the international quality assurance standards. QEC is also member of Quality Enhancement Cells Yahoo Network where it participates for sharing good practices among all QECs of Universities in the Country.

Accreditation of Academic Programs from Relevant Councils

The QEC team extends its support in accreditation process of academic programs when asked by the concerned department. The accreditation of programs is being done at the departmental level at CIIT. The departments get themselves accredited from their relevant accreditation bodies. The engineering programs are accredited by Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC), whereas Management Sciences programs are accredited by National Business Education Accreditation Council and Pharmacy programs by Pharmacy Council of Pakistan. The Computer Science programs are accredited by ABBET. Consultant QEC met the PEC Team on May 16, 2017 who was visiting regarding accreditation of BS Electrical Engineering at CIIT Islamabad.

CHAPTER 04

Faculty Development



Investing in human resources, more precisely the faculty and staff, has been a flagship initiative of CIIT. It is in this spirit that CIIT is running the largest faculty/staff development program in the country after HEC.

Human Resource Development

Human capital development and its management are very crucial to the universities to gain the competitive advantage in context of their national needs. In the same spirit, the Human Resource Development (HRD) program of CIIT has played a vital role in enhancing the development of the CIIT through establishing a sustainable pool of accomplished academics and researchers to serve the CIIT and the nation. Currently, CIIT is running one of the largest HRD program among the public and private sector universities in Pakistan. The Directorate of P, D and HRD has been entrusted with the responsibility to administer this program.

During the preceding sixteen years, CIIT has invested generously in human resource development through awarding MS and PhD level scholarships to its meritorious faculty/staff. During this time, over three hundred and sixty 360 fully funded scholarships have been awarded to the faculty/staff to pursue higher studies at some of the best universities in the world. Over 144 MS and over 120 PhD scholars have successfully completed studies on CIIT scholarship, returned back and are serving the Institution. Currently about 50 scholars are pursuing studies on CIIT funding. These scholarships were awarded through meritoriented albeit stringent criteria which was open to the deserving candidates both already serving and willing to serve CIIT upon award of scholarships and upon completion of studies.

Simultaneously, generous facilitation was provided to over 700 faculty/staff in securing funding from alternate sources; over 260 (56 MS and 208 PhD) scholars have returned back and are doing useful work. The balance number of scholars is at different stages of completing their studies and will be returning back in 01 to 03 years' time. The alternate sources were tapped through institutional arrangements agreed between the CIIT and other universities and those offered bu other funding agencies including Higher Education Commission, Fulbright Scholarship Program, Commonwealth Scholarships, AusAid Scholarships, merit awards offered by the universities abroad, etc. During the year 2016-17, about 100 scholars proceeded abroad to pursue their studies on alternate sources of funding. Today, CIIT proudly boasts of having excellent intellectual ensemble of over 1,100 PhDs in its faculty/staff corps.

The choice of subjects of candidates placed abroad was aligned with the Institution's long term priorities and the scholars remained under a keen vigil of the management and senior academics for their performance. Getting quality education, exposure to cutting-edge research, prospects of strengthening linkages with universities abroad and the scholars taking up productive work immediately upon their return back were the guiding principles.



The Directorate of P, D and HRD, towards achieving the HRD objectives of the CIIT, is persistently making efforts for placing candidates abroad for higher education through exploring and developing collegial networks with universities abroad. Under such arrangements few candidates were placed abroad on scholarship offered by the Sejong University, South Korea to pursue PhD studies. In continuation of HRD related efforts, few more candidates have been placed abroad on PhD scholarship under the Pakistan Knowledge Corridor Project of the Higher Education Commission Pakistan. Moreover, a series of informational & motivational seminars/meetings have been started for information of the prospective scholars. During the reporting period, 20 such events were organized.

It is also pertinent to mention here that the painstaking yet rewarding experience of investing in the able youth has particularly been rewarding through inculcating a research culture at CIIT which has helped it attain 2nd position in research productivity among over 180 public and private universities/degree awarding institutions in Pakistan. This is heartwarming especially so because the CIIT has a life of just 17 years.

Faculty Development Academy

Faculty Development Academy (FDA) has been working on professional development of CIIT faculty as well as nonfaculty of all of its eight campuses since October 2011. Over the past six years, FDA has launched diverse programs of trainings at different times of the year and for different levels, to enhance the knowledge and skills repertoire of its faculty/non-faculty members. Learning initiatives provide an enriched experience for our faculty, and also offer support in research, leadership, academic and administrative processes. In an age where student learning is evolving and changing, it is imperative that we strive to stay current with technological advances in teaching. Besides the training of faculty, FDA also organizes programs and initiatives that assist administrative officers and staff members for developing skills and competencies as professionals in order to prepare them for institutional efficiency and effectiveness. A summary of its activities during the year 2016-17 is given below:

In-Service Trainings

During the reporting period, following in-service trainings were organized by FDA to broaden the skills set of the faculty:

05 Days Professional Development Workshop (University of Faisalabad)

The workshop was organized for the faculty of the University of Faisalabad from July 18-22, 2016 under the MoU signed between two universities. 32 professionals from different departments constituted the target trainees. It was a residential workshop. The objective was to provide the participants a different intellectually stimulating environment facilitating their personal and professional growth with the help of eminent scholars, practitioners and researchers. Dr. S. M. Junaid Zaidi, Founder-Rector CIIT, was the chief guest at the closing ceremony.

05 Days Professional Development Workshop (Virtual Campus, CIIT)

FDA organized this workshop from July 26-30, 2016 for 52 members. They were divided into two groups and both were trained simultaneously. The objective of this training was to keep pace with modern andragogical requirements for the new entrant teachers. Eminent resource persons were invited to deliver lectures to the participants.

04 Days Workshop for Managing PhD Program

The workshop was organized from August 09-12, 2016. The purpose was to help the faculty evoke their interest for initiating PhD program equipping them with essential skills for selection of suitable candidates while enabling them to engage in advanced study and scholarly research. Learning protocols for thesis manuscript, internal reviewing and research ethics were also part and parcel of the workshop.





05 Days Professional Development Workshop (CIIT Attock)

FDA organized this workshop for faculty of CIIT Attock. A total of 43 faculty members attended the course. Eminent resource persons of prestigious organizations were invited to deliver lectures for addressing the needs and expectations of the trainees. The purpose of this workshop was to expose faculty members to modern andragogical requirements and to transform them into reflective teachers, applied researchers and dynamic role models for students and society at large.

Workshop on New Spirit, New Space-Japanese Technique of Woodblock Printmaking

This workshop was organized from October 20 - November 01, 2016 in collaboration with HEC and Japan Embassy. It was a very unique workshop for artists, art teachers and other professionals who wanted to learn new techniques of printing without a press. This workshop was conducted by Dr. Shahida Mansoor, Associate Professor, Department of Architecture, CIIT Islamabad. A Japanese resource person, Dr. Tetsuya Noda was invited from Japan for two days to enlighten the participants on several finer aspects of this technique. Prof. Dr. Raheel Qamar, Rector CIIT, graced the closing ceremony with his presence.

02 Weeks Professional Development Workshop (University of Baluchistan)

The workshop was organized for the faculty from December 13-23, 2016 at FDA. There were 23 participants from university of Baluchistan. The purpose of this training was to expose faculty to emerging frontiers of knowledge and dynamic personality development.

Workshop on Building High Impact Communication Skills

FDA organized this 02 days workshop in collaboration with Center for Policy Studies (CPS) from January 23-24, 2017. It was specifically designed for teachers and leaders. Dr. Khurram Sharif from Qatar University was the resource person.

03 Days Professional Development Workshop (Foundation University)

The workshop was arranged from January 25-27, 2017. The workshop was specifically organized on the request of the management of Foundation University. Prof. Dr. (Brig.) Akhtar N. Malik, Director Campus (Foundation University)' was the chief guest.

05 Days Workshop on Micro-Teaching - Becoming a Reflective Teacher

The workshop was held from January 30-February 03, 2017 and was totally sponsored by HEC. A total of 38 participants from eight campuses of CIIT and some of local universities i.e. Fatima Jinnah Women University, NUML, Arid Agriculture, Air University, attended the workshop.

05 Weeks Professional Development Workshop for Young Faculty

The workshop was conducted from February 27-March 31, 2017. A modular approach was adopted and eminent scholars, researchers, practitioners, distinguished professionals, journalists and diplomats were invited as resource persons. The objectives of the workshop were to enable the participants build their capacity and embark upon personal and professional growth as teachers, researchers and administrators.

Professional Development Training for COMSATS Headquarters Officers

The training was arranged for the COMSATS Headquarters Employees from April 03-07, 2017. The objective of the workshop included capacity building of the officers. On the directions of Executive Director, Dr. S.M. Junaid Zaidi, the workshop was conducted for preparing the officers for a visit abroad (Italy and France). 15 officers were trained in total. A parallel 05 days course was organized for the staff.

05 Days Workshop on Teaching as a Profession

The workshop was organized in CIIT Lahore from April 08-12, 2017. 35 young faculty members (05 from CIIT Sahiwal and the rest from Lahore) constituted the audience.

4th Strategic Development Workshop for HoDs

As per past practice, FDA organized a 03 days workshop from May 15-17, 2017. The venue for this workshop was Youth Development Center, Punjab House Murree. Twenty four male Heads of various departments from CIIT's six campuses (including Virtual Campus) constituted the audience. The purpose was to devise strategies to refresh commitment of HoDs, help them expand their knowledge which will be beneficial in growth and continual development of CIIT. The HoDs interacted with each other and shared their respective areas of strengths and weaknesses for making improvement and efficiency in their respective departments.

Accomplishments of International Faculty

CIIT today is well placed to push more aggressively its internationalization strategy to consolidate the past and present gains and to build on them by further uplifting the quality of teaching, research, and public impact. International faculty members make invaluable contribution through their own unique world views, work ethics, humanitarian concern as well as teaching methodologies, approaches to finding solutions to emerging research problems, and making indelible societal impact.




Student Enrollment


CIIT started its journey in 2000 with just 277 students. Since then, its enrollment is on up rise which is a clear indication of education standards at its campuses. During the reporting period, the students enrolled at CIIT were 34,485. The Islamabad Campus led with 8,423 students followed by Abbottabad Campus with 5,773 students. 
Degree-Wise Student Enrollment

Campus-Wise Student Enrollment Percentages




Equity

Gender-wise Detail of Student Enrolment



University Industry Linkages

Creating an interface between academia and industry is the most important tool in transferring the knowledge and providing students with the exposure of practical world. University-industry linkages are central in providing students with the opportunities to gain experience, work on real world problems and in return the pool of skilled and learned candidates increases for the industry. The efforts by various departments/campuses of CIIT in this regard during the reporting period are given below:

Cotton Craft PVT Ltd

IRCBM at CIIT Lahore signed an agreement with Cotton Craft PVT Ltd on December 20, 2016. The purpose of this agreement is to develop wound dressings.

COMSATS Dairy Development Centre

Business/Technology Incubation Center

The Business Incubation Center (BIC) aims at commercialization of CIIT research and development. This is to be achieved through rapid and sustainable development of economy by deploying knowledge inputs to the society. The vision relies on education and technology inputs especially which are available/developed at CIIT to industry, agriculture, health to contribute towards improvement of socio-economic structure of Pakistan. CIIT has initiated development of a series of business/technology incubators

named CUBATORs. There are currently 32 companies being hosted at these incubation centers.

Student Startup Business Centre (SSBC)

With a view to nurture an entrepreneurial culture and support students in launching their own knowledge based businesses, CIIT launched the Student Startup Business Centre (SSBC) in 2016. The program offers guidance, mentorship, and technical support to potential student entrepreneurs, as well as facilitating them with free work space and seed funds in order to fully support the most promising start-ups. SSBC is modeled on a unique thought process that is mindful of the current socio-economic environment prevailing in the country. It aims to create a sizeable number of small and medium sized businesses every year, each generating direct employment for knowledge workers and aims to become the leading centre for learning and model for advancement in the area of student based entrepreneurship in the country.



SSBC has also been launched at CIIT Abbottabad. A team visited the Campus on June 14, 2017 in which the participants were briefed about the objectives and functions of SSBC. The importance of an entrepreneurial culture in the university asserting the need to promote knowledge based startups was also highlighted. A presentation was also delivered to the students about the process and road map of SSBC, in order to raise awareness about CIIT entrepreneurship initiative and motivated the students to actively enroll in the SSBC program.

It was a moment of great pride for CIIT when a SSBC facility was inaugurated at CIIT Attock on May 26, 2017. The SSBC enrolled students gave presentations regarding the progress of their startups and displayed their prototypes. Executive Director SSBC during his remarks highlighted the importance of entrepreneurial culture in varsities. He advised the students to gear up their startups to avail the opportunities

being offered to them and facilities provided by SSBC to promote knowledge based economy.

A SSBC facility was launched at CIIT Sahiwal as well on December 07, 2016. Followed by ideas submission process by students of CIIT Sahiwal, 56 potential ideas were submitted under this initiative. A team from SSBC, CIIT Islamabad visited CIIT Sahiwal on January 20, 2017 to conduct final selection of the student ideas.

Various activities carried out by SSBC, CIIT Islamabad during the reporting period are as follows:

- The session on "Business Simulations: Competitive Strategy Game" was held on May 12, 2017 by Dr. Adil Tahir Paracha, Assistant Professor, CIIT Islamabad. The session emphasized on different aspects of simulations used for businesses. These simulations can focus on a wide variety of topics and objectives, ranging from strategy alignment to capability building in the areas of business acumen, leadership, sales, innovation and others. Dr. Adil elaborated the purpose of business simulations is to experience the corporate world by becoming an executive of the company and determining its faith through decisions made in a volatile environment.
- SSBC in collaboration with Startup Hub organized an event "Lead Your Dreams & Music Fiesta" on May 17, 2017. The event provided awareness about entrepreneurship as an alternative career option for students having innovative ideas that could be transformed into businesses. The Speakers Mr. Naimat Khan Durani and Mr. Amir Iqbal gave motivational talks on hassles which are faced by budding entrepreneurs. They shared their personal experiences with starting new business. The overall objective was to motivate students towards starting their enterprises and creating opportunities for other graduates. The event also raised awareness about the services offered by SSBC.
- ► The talk on "Personal Development of an Entrepreneur" was held on April 19, 2017 by Mr. Noshad Minhas, Head

- Cash Management Silk Bank. The talk emphasized on aspects of personal development of an entrepreneur which are required to be able to deal with the sudden changes and appropriate actions & reactions so that they can stay in the game. Mr. Noshad elaborated how self developments and self improvement can be catalysts of change that bring further success to the future of one's business.
- SSBC organized a session on "Startups from Idea to Execution" by Mr. Syed Ahmed, (Chief Executive of DPL-IT) on March 17, 2017. The objective of this session was to familiarize the participants regarding different stages of the startups. The session elaborated upon following areas:
 - ► Startup: idea conception to operations
 - Product engineering
 - Product market fit
 - Scale operations

Department of Computer Science, CIIT Islamabad arranged on campus recruitment drive in collaboration with Alachisoft; an international company and leading provider of high performance solutions for the .NET as well as the Java development community. Besides, career development cells at all other campuses provide proper guidance to the students regarding their internships and career as well. Various organizations are contacted by the campuses itself to depute the students and regular feedback is asked from the head of the organizations so that the performance of the students is assessed for further improvement.

A career counseling seminar followed by one to one career clinic was conducted at CIIT Islamabad on March 03, 2017. Syed Azhar Hasnain Abidi, Chief Executive, Pakistan Institute of Career Counseling was the resource person for the session. Development Projects

The Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) is the main instrument for providing budgetary resources for the development projects and programs CIIT campuses namely Islamabad, Abbottabad, Wah, Lahore, Attock, Sahiwal, and Vehari. Until the end of financial year viz Financial Year (FY) 2016-17, CIIT has successfully completed 48 projects (Annex-B) having capital cost of Rs. 8770.474 million.


Research Equipment



E-Library

CIIT Library is also developing its own E-Books Library, and continuously e-books at various subjects are downloaded on daily basis from different free/subscribed databases. The





Besides, 60,000 online books are also available through the Digital Library Program of HEC. The e-books support program allowed researchers to access most of the important text and reference books electronically in a variety of subject areas.

Other digital/electronic services provided by CIIT Islamabad library include Free Online Public Access Journals, Access to Scopus Database, Electronic Document Delivery Services, Video Conferencing Room, Computer Workstations with a seating area for about 1000 users with 300 computers on various floors of the library, Wi-Fi, Innovative/Hi-Tech, RFID Management System, etc.

CIIT Union Catalogue

Union Catalogue contains records of all CIIT libraries holdings and allows the users to search entire CIIT libraries at once. The purpose of CIIT Union Catalogue is to provide access to books available in CIIT libraries using a single search interface. Searching will return a list of extracted bibliographic information along with details of the library/libraries that owns them.

Union Catalogue can be extremely helpful if the user is searching for a specific title, or, looking for material that is no available at one campus and thus can be acquired by loar from the other campus where it is available (http://www3.comsats.edu.pk/uc/)

Pakistan Education and Research Network (PERN)

The PERN connects universities and research institutes through high-speed internet bandwidth. The main purpose of this network is to facilitate researchers/students in sharing data and to coordinate with each other though video conferencing.

During 2016-2017, PERN bandwidth at CIIT Islamabad was 400 Mbps.

CIIT Abbottabad was connected to PERN in July 2007. Initially campus acquired 4Mbps dedicated connectivity via PERN1 project of HEC. Now the campus has high speed dedicated connectivity via PERN2 over fiber optics. The campus has 160Mbps internet bandwidth to fulfill the day to day educational and research requirements of campus. CIIT Abbottabad is aiming to upgrade the Internet bandwidth to 200Mbps in near future. CIIT Abbottabad also has privilege of being the active partner with the PERN. CIIT Abbottabad is serving as point-of-presence (POP site) for Hazara and connecting regions having 1Gbps connectivity in PERN2 long haul network.

CIIT Wah Campus is availing 80 Mbps bandwidth facility from Higher Education Commission under PERN2 Project.

CIIT Lahore also took the internet services from PERN under the bandwidth of 500 Mbps per month.

All other campuses except CIIT Vehari are availing PERN facilitu.

Video Conferencing Facilities

Video conferencing has enabled all users to connect, communicate, conference, and share information in any environment. At CIIT, video conferencing is currently utilized for distance learning program (Virtual Campus), and to conduct meetings for efficient and effective use of its time and resources.



Campus Management Solution (CMS)

CIIT approved IT policy in 2014 to stream line it services and processes in all campuses of the organization. During the reporting period, following activities were carried out in this regard:

Real time integration of Fee management with Banks CUOnline developed services and backend system to integrate with banks IT in 2016-17. Banks have started to integrate with the same and integration with one bank was completed in June 2017. This has made CIIT first university to process fee related bank transactions in real time. Integration is underway with other banks as each bank has its own rules/processing environment and integration requirements. This has greatly reduced manual work and reliability of

CIIT Information App for Smart Phones

transaction processing without human errors.

CUOnline launched an app for smart phones for all campuses for prospective students, parents and general public. App lists programs, departments, important contacts, transport routes, library and other information needed by end users in easy navigation. App is designed to deliver relevant data to all CIIT campuses. CUOnline login is added in the app and now students can see their marks/important notifications from mobile phones. App can now send mass messages to all app users as well using a CMS. (April-June, 2017)

New Modules for Lahore Campus

New modules for DDP academic rules/result processing for Lahore campus are developed, tested by the campus and deployed in record time. (January-April, 2017)

Deployment of COMSIAN Portal

COMSIAN portal is deployed after all requirements shared by the department were completed during August 2016 to May 2017

Improvements in Systems Security

Systems security is significantly enhanced to mitigate emerging threats with the evolution of technology. This is an ongoing process and system is sufficiently dealing with cyber-attacks. (September 2016-January 2017)

Automation of Foundation University Medical College and Regular Campus

As per contract between CIIT and Foundation University Islamabad (FUI), detailed requirements analysis was initiated at FUI to automate its various processes as per custom needs they have in May 2017.

Extension in Support Contract with Ghulam Ishaq Khan Institute (GIKI)

One year's extension of contract with GIKI was secured after system was successfully deployed there to cater new requirements in various systems implemented there in August 2016.

Online Admission System

A robust Admissions System which offers various new features including online integration support to several other systems is fully operational at CIIT. The campus-wise breakdown of the submitted applications through Online Admission System during the reporting period is tabulated below:

Sports

Sports are an important aspect of academic life and it complements the education. They help in increasing the depth of personality development of students and help them equip with traits like decision making and leadership ability, cooperation, team work, time management, etc.

CIIT organizes the Students' Week in every semester to cater the sports need of students. The detail of such activities during the reporting period is as follows:

Inter-departmental Sports

There are multiple departments at CIIT and students from each department actively participate in inter-departmental sports events to score and claim the trophy for their department. A week long slot is allocated in the schedule of every semester for students' week. The week offers students a short pause to recover from hectic and exhausting academic activities. Students participate in various cocurricular activities where they get ample opportunities to bring out their covert natural abilities. Students' week also provides youth at the CIIT with the prospects of working in collaboration, exercising leadership potential, taking initiatives and improving their social and behavioral skills. In the same spirit, Students' Weeks were organized in Fall 2016 (September 27-October 05, 2016) and Spring 2017 (April 01-09, 2017) at CIIT Islamabad as a continuing tradition. As CIIT has consolidated its infrastructure and has expanded its Campuses, capital is invested in land and equipment, etc. The noncurrent assets have increased by 7.7% and amount to Rs. 5,112,024,807.

Audit Report

Audit of the Accounts of CIIT up to June 30, 2016 by the Government and statutory audit has been completed. The audit for the year 2016-17 is in process.

Development Budget

The Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) is the main instrument for providing budgetary resources for the development projects and programs of all campuses of CIIT. Until the end of financial year viz Financial Year (FY) 2016-17, CIIT has successfully completed 48 projects having capital cost of Rs. 8770.474 million.

For the financial year 2016-17, the Government of Pakistan allocated Rs. 214.652 million for 04 development projects of CIIT. During the said period, Rs. 194.652 million have been released.

University Governance



Board of Governors

In Pakistan there are typically two types of educational institutions in the public sector; in the first group a bi-cameral governing structure in the shape of Senate and Syndicate is in place while in other group, uni-cameral system is prevalent with either a

Syndicate or a Board of Governors (BoG). CIIT falls in the second

category having only the Board of Governors.

BoG supervises and controls administrative, academic, and financial affairs, and lays down policies of the Institute. The meeting of BoG is held biannually, and is chaired by Executive Director, Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS). The members of BoG

Uniform Management System (UMS)

UMS system was introduced at CIIT in 2009 at Abbottabad Campus and became functional across all CIIT campuses in 2012.

Objectives of Uniform Management System (UMS): The main objectives of UMS are:

- To standardize all the aspects of institute
- ► To develop quality teaching and research productivity through planning and monitoring, feedback and control

In order to achieve afore mentioned objectives three committees namely Campus Management Committee (CMC), Campus Academic Regulatory Committee (CARC), and Departmental Academic Regulatory Committee (DARC) were constituted on January 24, 2012. They plan strategies and formulate procedures for improving the quality of education at Departmental and Campus levels. CU Online (web-based software) is used to gather feedback by generating various monitoring reports whereas CARC at campus level and by DARC at department level look into the issues hindering in the way of achieving objectives and also suggest the solutions to overcome these problems.

СМС

The Campus Management Committee meetings are held before the start of semester to foresee the issues which Campus may come across and then these issues are resolved. This committee takes care of matters like availability of class rooms, furniture, books etc.

CARC

CARC works to ensure the uniformity, consistency, harmony and maximum utilization of campus resources to meet the standards prescribed under the UMS. The committee comprises of different members who are both from academic and administration facets and work at campus level. Campus In charge/ Director is the convener of CARC. It must have at least five sessions during per given semester to formulate, ensure systematize and timely flow of information, and procedures compliance. It is also responsible to place a

check to ensure quality education, and all the departments of the campuses are required to meet the standards as prescribed by Campus/Institute. It ensures the harmony and cooperation among the departments of the same campuses.

DARC

DARC entertains all the matters related to department and its prime objective is to create harmony within the department by implementing approved policies and procedures. DARC comprises of at least three senior members of the department. Head of the department is the convener of DARC. This committee is solely authorized to ensure and take necessary measures to improve education system and correlated issues, using qualitative as well as quantitative measures. The committee meets all the faculty of the department at least twice per semester. All disputed/unsolved matters are referred to CARC. Introducing the new disciplines among courses is one of the important functions of DARC. It is responsible to ensure efficient grading and marking of papers, assignments, quizzes, and sessionals by the faculty during a semester.

Individual Semester Plan Proforma (ISPP)

ISPP is a tool to analyze and evaluate the academic and research work of all PhD faculty members. Three reports are generated on the basis of data given by each department i.e. ISPPs report, discrepancy report, and minimum and maximum workload report of PhDs. It helps in having a clear view of work done by the PhDs in previous and current semester. The main purpose of this proforma is to know the efforts through the students supervised and published articles. It also describes the classes load, linkages with international universities and individuals, faculty's commitment for outreach programs and other administrative responsibilities undertaken by PhD faculty, if any. When UMS was introduced at Institute level our office used to collect information regarding PhD Faculty through ISPP forwarded to faculty through chairpersons. Then it was decided by the competent authority to make it available on CU Online, where faculty could have easy access to these proforma. Therefore, since last four semesters ISPP have become a permanent feature of faculty portal.

CHAPTER 14

Office of Development



Various activities carried out by Office of Developments at CIIT campuses during the reporting period are as follows:

Initiatives and implementation

- Office of Development at CIIT Abbottabad organized a Seminar on Career Counseling for graduating students on May 18, 2017. Syed Azhar Hussain, Consultant, CIIT Islamabad was the guest speaker. He has more than 22 years of experience in career counseling, education management, training of counselors, advisors teachers and school managers at different levels. After the seminar One to One counseling session was also conducted.
- Prime Minister Fee Reimbursement Cheque Distribution Ceremony on May 29, 2017. Subject scheme enabled needy students from less developed areas to pursue their studies in their area of interest. Prof. Dr. Arshad Pervez, Director CIIT Abbottabad was the chief guest of the event. Cheques of Rs. 15 million were distributed among 169 students
- Office of Development at CIIT Vehari provided scholarship to needy students through various schemes like USAID Merit & Need Based Scholarship, NTS Need Based Scholarships, German Need Based, and French Need Based, etc. during the reporting period.
- Along with the newly launched scholarships, Registrar Office worked on previously running scholarship and Financial Aid Schemes such as HEC Need Based scholarships, French Need Based scholarships, German Need Based scholarship, Workers Welfare Board scholarships, Pak-USAID Merit and Needs Based Scholarship, ICT R&D scholarships, NTS Needs Based Scholarship, Afghan Students Scholarship, Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF) Scholarship, Shahbaz Shareef Scholarships, Meezan Bank Qarz e

Hasna Schemes, scholarships for children of industrial workers at Lahore, fee waiver scheme for children of Pak Army at CIIT Abbottabad, and fee waiver for wards of employees of POF Wah Cantt. 21,772 students were awarded scholarship these various scholarships during the reporting period disbursing total amount of Rs. 1,246,374,576.

Besides, meetings were also conducted with various donor agencies for smooth continuation of scholarships and timely release of the fund during the reporting period:

Future Plans

- To improve fund disbursement mechanism throughout CIIT campuses for timely release of funds to the scholarship recipients.
- To expand scholarship net by creating new opportunities for launching new scholarship programs with support of different donor agencies. In this regard, MOU's shall be signed with different donor agencies to promote the awareness and cause of scholarships.
- Strengthening SFAO in campuses and bringing dedicated staff for running the affairs of scholarships.
- Establishing stringent monitoring controls pertaining to scholarship affairs across all CIIT campuses.

CHAPTER 15

Health Center Medical Facilities



Medical Facilities

Healthcare of the students and staff of CIIT has always been a priority. Keeping this in view, CIIT Medical Center was established in 2009 functioning under the supervision of a qualified, experienced and competent Medical Team.

It is a three beds observatory providing free first aid medical treatment and consultation to the patients. There are four medical doctors, three trained staff nurses and two trained paramedics. It is operational 06 days a week.

The activities carried out by the medical center include provision of first aid services to the students and staff of CIIT, provision of free medicines to all patients, provision of medical cover during official conferences and meetings, and arranging various healthcare awareness programs/lectures. During the reporting period, following activities were organized by the center:



- Medical checkup of drivers was done in September 2016
- First Aid training was arranged for lab staff of Department of Electrical Engineering by PRCS in October 2016
- Medical cover given to COMSATS Premier League in May 2017
- ▶ Blood donation camps were arranged

The facilities available at the center are ECG, nebulization, blood sugar checking, eyesight checking, dressing/stitches, BP monitoring, maintaining I/V line, injections including Tetanus Vaccination etc. and fully equipped ambulance.

The center treats various injuries (cuts, abrasions, blunt trauma etc), minor road accidents, fever, respiratory tract infections, gastro intestinal tract problems, various gynae problems, burns, dermatitis/scabies, headaches, hypertension, signs of breathlessness/allergy, diarrhea, diabetes, minor anxiety, and depression etc.

A referral mechanism is in place for shifting of patients to tertiary care hospitals through a well equipped CIIT ambulance.

Medical center at CIIT Abbottabad treated multiple patients during the reporting period. It is comprised of one senior medical officer and one dispenser. All necessary facilities are available at the center whereas serious emergencies are referred to Ayub Teaching Hospital and CMH Abbottabad.

The Health Center at CIIT Lahore is functioning under the supervision of well qualified Resident Medical Officer (RMO). It provides medical support to its day scholars, hostilities, employees, visitors and the resident and their families free of cost. Emergency services are also available round the clock (24/7) for the university population. More than 100 patients are treated per day. The center is equipped with patient bed, wheel chair, blood pressure apparatus, sugar checkup apparatus, weighing machine, oxygen cylinder, nebulizer, etc. An ambulance is also available to deal with emergencies. First Aid facility is also available at Wah, Attock, Sahiwal, and

Dental Unit at CIIT Islamabad

Vehari campuses to deal with unforeseen cases.

Dental Unit Department at CIIT Islamabad is operational since May 2015. Dental unit department has a specialized dentist with professional dental staff who provides a complete dental care with highest standard of treatment. During the reporting period, the chief complaints treated at department were 2,000. A new sterilization machine was also installed which is doing sterilization according to the latest methods having the protocols of W.H.O during the reporting period. The Unit is providing free dental oral medicines to students and faculty

members and doing multiple dental procedures. Following awareness activities were arranged by the dental unit during the reporting period:

- Precaution to avoid teeth staining (June-August 2016)
- Tips to avoid teeth cavities (August-September 2016)
- Brushing techniques (November-December 2016)
- Importance of dental floss in daily life (December 2016-February 2017)
- Oral hygiene maintenance (April-July 2017)

Counseling for Stress Reduction

Counseling for stress is frequently provided to the students and employees at all CIIT campuses through medical centers and student centers.
